

Guidelines for Shipping Samples to Brazil

Step 1

Document Submission

The following documents should be provided to the logistics company responsible for handling the shipment:

1. Commercial Invoice and Packing List, fully completed with batch number, production date, expiration date, volume in milliliters, alcohol content, product category (red wine, white wine, rosé, sparkling wine, etc.), and all other relevant product information;
2. Copies of the product labels containing the same information listed in the documents above;
3. Certificate of Analysis;
4. Certificate of Origin;
5. Free Sales Certificate (if available);
6. Contract for participation in ProWine São Paulo.

Step 2

MAPA Authorization

Once all required documents have been collected, the logistics company will submit an application to MAPA (Brazil's Ministry of Agriculture) to obtain authorization for the shipment of samples.

The authorization process usually takes up to **five business days**.

Step 3

Shipment and Customs Clearance

After MAPA authorization is granted, the samples can be shipped to Brazil.

When the shipment arrives, an inspection of the samples will be carried out and all supporting documentation will be reviewed. The information provided in the documents must correspond to the specifications on the labels and samples.

Once the MAPA import licenses have been issued, the customs clearance process will proceed. This process typically takes an additional **seven business days**.

After customs clearance is completed, the samples may either be stored by the logistics company or delivered directly to the event venue, depending on the arrangements made.
